Wine For Hunger Relief

In 2007 Dr. Joe H. Campbell, co-founder of Elk Cove Vineyards, volunteered in a small medical clinic in Arequipa, Peru. Before returning home to Oregon, he asked his colleagues how he could continue to help. They told him the most critical health need was for food assistance. Because of Joe's experience as a winemaker, he came up with a plan to produce a limited production wine each year, all proceeds of which would contribute to the hunger relief program.

Our 2018 Condor Pinot Noir

This wine has gorgeous fruit-forward aromatics and is juicy with bright cherry flavors in the glass. Condor will improve with bottle age for 5-10 years. We are very excited about this vintage - in 2018 we saw small berries and clusters in the vineyard with great concentration of flavor.

Condor is sourced from Elk Cove Vineyards' esteemed La Bohème Vineyard's West Block. Whole berries make up 50% of the fermenting must to maximize fruitiness from these 29 to 34-year-old vines. Condor Pinot Noir is aged for 10 months in French oak.
